
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Background

The Named Person Service (NPS) was developed collaboratively between North Ayrshire Health and Social Care Partnership (NAHSCP) and North Ayrshire Council Education and Youth Employment (NAC EYE).


The Named Person Service operates in line with 'Getting it right for every child' (GIRFEC) principles.



Methodology

The Named Person Service:

- Supports and advises 0–18 years Named Persons and Lead Professionals
- Supports professionals across North Ayrshire who have a wellbeing concern for a child/children
- Manages a live, central database of Named Persons within North Ayrshire
- Facilitates a request for assistance (RfA) process, including receipt and processing of RfA forms and forwarding to the appropriate service, with follow-up as required
- Produces NP/LP service directories containing upto-date information on local services for children, young people and their families
- Identifies and supports
 Named Persons for children
 and young people from
 exceptional groups outwith
 mainstream education
 (traveller children, educated
 at home, and 16–18 year olds
 who have left education
- Develops, monitors and evaluates processes relating to GP concerns.



Aims/Objectives

North Ayrshire's Named Person Service supports Scottish Government's 2020 vision by providing a single support hub for health, social care and education professionals, including:

- Facilitating safe and efficient sharing of information across children's services
- Encouraging services to share wellbeing concerns appropriately and proportionately
- Ensuring consistent and standardised approach to child wellbeing across North Ayrshire through support offered to Named Persons and Lead Professionals.

Results/Outcomes

Since September 2017:

- 3,207 requests for assistance have been processed
- All Named Persons, and an increasing number of Lead
 Professionals, utilise the service
- 55 NHS, local authority, HSCP, third sector and community services received requests for assistance
- Comprehensive service directory produced and updated every six months
- Development and testing of a wellbeing concern/ notification of service involvement form and process with adult health and social care services.
